The World is Now Suffering with the Pandemic COVID 19 a New Strain of Corona Virus The research team at Northumbria University found a need to add a bactericide to a wash or wet clean process at low temperatures to be effective at killing micro organisms and your Guild had obtained a suitable product named PAP 6 for use in these trials. PAP 6, phthalimido peroxy hexanoic acid, has become increasingly popular in consumer and professional detergents and is also sometimes used in personal care products. It is known for its effectiveness in removing stubborn stains, such as grass, tea, coffee, tomato, etc., and for getting rid of malodour and in killing germs, bacteria and fungi on textiles. A small box should now be open (Go to link https://youtu.be/-Yw2KYwLVxs I Change I Remove) Do now a left hand mouse click on this link. The video should now run for 22 minutes. Only dry cleaning testing was done on the solvent Perchloroethylene and it was found that no micro organisms crossed over in any cleaning process and no micro organisms were found in solvent wastes or in the DC machine. Due to financial constraints no higher wash temperature than 30°C was tested and in Dry Cleaning no alternative solvents were tested due to lack of funds.

Sadly, although very understandable, in the current corona virus situation the 2020 CleanEx Exhibition Planned to be held at Ascot Racecourse 26/27th of April has been postponed for a year and will now be held the same week end in 2021.
