Good News For Seventeen Students

After a training programme and a two and half hour written examination 17 students passed and will soon receive their certificates. They enrolled on a Guild Supervisory Training Course that, when completed, they had to take the examination of Intermediate Laundry Technology. During the course they had practical assessments in four laundry disciplines.

Research Project With the help of a number of cleaners in the North East, your Guild, in cooperation with the Worshipful Company of Launderers', and the Northumbria University, are to co fund a research project to investigate the cross-bio contamination of textiles in both wet and dry cleaning processes. This follows two separate television documentaries on the likelihood of a future pandemic/epidemic such as the so called Spanish Flue Pandemic after the second world war. The trend in our industry is to process at ever lower temperatures to save energy, and to prolong fabric life, and traditionally higher temperatures have been used to ensure the hygiene of textiles. The research will (A) check out the longevity of live bacteria under ambient conditions, (B) in simulated washing conditions investigate the effectiveness of wet cleaning on the removal of pathogenic bacteria from natural and synthetic fibre. (C) as in B but with dry cleaning solvents, (D) all above with and without bactericide. Being forewarned and prepared is better than having to react later.

Alternatives to single use plastics

In the last two issues we have mentioned alternatives to polythene for packaging following the greater customer awareness of the damage to our environment that can occur by misuse of plastics. We have previously mentioned that your Guild have a number of members sitting on a committee looking at some of the issues involved but can you help by advising us on what alternatives you have come across, or already use. Minimum Wage 2019/2020

Further to the UK budget announcements at the end of October, rate changes to the Minimum Wage have been confirmed for April 2019. These are in line with the recommendations that were made by the low pay commission. They are as follows

Employee earnings in the UK: 2018 In April 2018, median gross weekly earnings for full-time employees were £569, up 3.5% from £550 in 2017. The 3.5% growth seen this year is the highest growth in earnings since 2008. (The median is the value separating the higher half from the lower half of a data sample.)
