**Updated Guidance Apprenticeship funding** This guidance has been updated to reflect the change in registration date for non-levy paying employers. Employers who do not pay the levy will not be able to use the apprenticeship service to pay for apprenticeship training and assessment until at least mid-2019, unless they are receiving a transfer of funds from a levy paying employer. Instead, they will need to agree a payment schedule with the provider and pay them directly for the training. The provider must prove that the employer has paid their contributions as a condition of the government paying its contribution. In addition, the 'Apprenticeship funding: rules and guidance for employers' for August 2018 to July 2019 has now been published. It can be viewed at

**Paternity leave** It is believed that the take up of paternity leave dropped last year for the first time in five years. This is in sharp contrast to the take up of maternity leave which is believed to have tripled. This is in accordance with figures obtained from HM Revenue and Customs.

**Unemployment** The number of people in work has continued to edge ahead, though the employment rate was unchanged on the quarter. However, the number of vacancies is a new record high, while the unemployment rate is now at its lowest since the winter of 1974-75. The growth in employment is still being driven by UK nationals, with a noticeable drop over the past year in the number of workers from the so-called 'A8' eastern European countries in particular. *Fig from ONS* 

Automation This month, a survey conducted by You Gov was published, which considered the expectations and views of workers on the impact of automation in the workplace. Some of the figures are listed below: 53 per cent of workers are optimistic about their future working life and job prospects, when thinking about technology change in the next decade. Workers aged under 45 are more optimistic than older workers. Only 29 per cent think technology will have no effect on their current job over the next 10 years. 44 per cent of workers think changes in technology will have a positive effect on their current job, but 20 per cent of workers think there will be a negative effect.

**Reducing The Cost of Water and Effluent Charges** Your Guild has arranged with Phil Murdey, Director of Sales at Aquaflow Utilities, that Guild members interested in reducing their water purchase and waste water disposal costs can contact him to have a proposal on how much they could save by switching suppliers. Since April 2017, the water market in England has been open for competition and as a result businesses do not have to buy water services any longer from local Wholesale Water Supply Companies.
